DUTY FREE ALLOWANCES

All passengers over the age of 18 years may bring with them the following items:

Up to 1 Litre of potable spirits or 4 litres of wine or 1 case (not exceeding 8 litres) of beer.

- UP to 200 cigarettes
- OR 100 cigarillos
- OR 25 cigars
- OR 250 grammes tobacco

In addition, Cayman Residents returning from a visit overseas may bring with them dutiable or household articles, at the discretion of the Collector, up to the value of \$350.00.

WARNING

Cayman residents must declare the total value of ALL articles acquired abroad (whether by purchase, as a gift or otherwise) which are in their or their family's possession at the time of arrival.

Visitors to the Cayman Islands must declare the total value of ALL gifts, foods, spirits, liquor, tobacco products and any articles which they are intending to leave or consume in the Islands.

The transportation of money regardless of the amount is legal. "Money" means cash or bearer negotiable instruments. "Bearer negotiable instrument" means a money instrument in bearer form and includes: (a) traveler's cheque (b) a negotiable instrument (including a cheque, promissory note, money order) that is either in bearer form or otherwise in such form that title thereto is passed upon delivery (c) an incomplete instrument (including a cheque, promissory note or money order) signed, but with the payee's name omitted. "Cash" means bank notes or coins that are legal tender in any country whether or not convertible.

However, if you bring into the Cayman Islands \$15,000 or more (CI or foreign equivalent, or a combination of both) you must declare it and you must also file additional particulars with Customs on the form provided. Failure to make such declaration for the total amount you are carrying may lead to seizure of all the money (cash or bearer negotiable instruments), and may subject you to civil penalties and/or criminal prosecution.

**FAILURE TO MAKE A FULL DECLARATION IS AN OFFENSE AND CAN

PROHIBITED OR RESTRICTED GOODS

The importation of controlled drugs and utensils used therewith is absolutely prohibited.

The importation of spear guns, Hawaiian slings and parts, etc., is prohibited.

The importation of firearms and ammunition is prohibited unless accompanied by a permit signed by the Commissioner of Police, Cayman Islands; or District Commissioner; Cayman Brac.

Plants, plant products, live animals, animal products, and aggregate material may be imported only if the owner is in possession of a valid permit issued by the Cayman Islands Department of Agriculture.
